**Dear Hagley Members and Friends:**

As you'll see in the annual letter from Board President Henry B. duPont IV, we've accomplished much in the past year to preserve our historic site and collections. After relocating museum operations to our upper property as we continue rebuilding from the flood, our visitors have remarked how much they love spending more time in our gardens and orchard. As the new pollinator and rose gardens begin to take shape this year, the natural world of Hagley takes center stage.

We hope you'll be inspired to build your own habitat that encourages pollinators to thrive! Wild bees are crucial pollinators for the Hagley orchard and gardens. Yet six species of native mason bees in Delaware and the surrounding Mid-Atlantic states have been in decline year after year. This infusion of native and other beneficial plants, such as common milkweed, aromatic aster, and purple coneflower, will help keep our bee population healthy as the pollinator garden begins to grow. We also have plans to put beehives throughout this area to support healthy bee colonies. Many thanks to Corteva for supporting the pollinator garden.

This year marks the 40th anniversary of Hagley's fireworks program. What began in 1982 to celebrate

the 25th anniversary of Hagley Museum has grown into one of the region's finest and most loved pyrotechnic displays. We have something special in store this year, so please order your tickets for the June 10 and 17 shows as we anticipate a big demand.

The Hagley Library continues to process and make available collections important to the history of business and technology. One such collection that is now open gives insight to DuPont's marketing and advertising strategy in the 20th century. In the 1930s, in an effort to rebrand the company, DuPont hired the firm Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborn, or BBDO, who then coined the term for DuPont, "Better Things for Better Living...through Chemistry."

**L**ooking for things that are engaging, educational or just entertaining for the family this summer? Hagley offers numerous ways to get the whole family having fun.

On Summer Science Saturdays, families discover exciting science and engineering principles through experiments and demonstrations, while also experiencing those principles in action with fun summertime activities. For example, on June 25, visitors will learn how chemistry is all around us by doing hands-on chemistry experiments. They can then find out how chemistry was used in the past at Hagley by making Funpowder—a fun, edible version of Hagley’s own black powder.

Summer Science Saturdays will be featured every second and fourth Saturday, June through August.

Alternating with Summer Science Saturdays is our popular Fishing on the Brandywine activity.

With bamboo poles and bait provided by Hagley, find a shady, quiet spot along the Brandywine and see what is biting this season. Expert guides assist with baiting hooks and releasing fish.

More exciting options this summer include powder yard demonstrations, activities on Workers’ Hill, and tours of the du Pont residence and gardens. Bring a picnic lunch and make a full day of it on Saturdays or any other day of week at Hagley. ## Significant Ad Archive Opens in Library

**H**AGLEY LIBRARY HAS OPENED the Batten, Barton, Durstine & Osborn collection. BBDO is a legendary New York advertising firm founded in 1928 that traces its history back to 1891 with the George Batten Company. The archive includes material from the George Batten Company into the early twenty-first century, over a century of advertising history.

The collection includes advertisements, market research reports, company correspondence, internal publications, biographical files, newspaper clippings, photographs, and motion pictures. It contains a wealth of information about ad campaigns for some of the most influential businesses of the twentieth century.

In the 1930s, BBDO produced the first consumer advertising for the DuPont Company and introduced their famous slogan "Better things for better living ... through chemistry." They also created advertising campaigns around familiar slogans such as "Mmm mmm good!" (Campbell's Soup), "Ring around the collar" (Unilever), and "Have it your way" (Burger King).

BBDO was among the first ad agencies to organize a radio department and produced programs for clients, including *Cavalcade of America* for DuPont, which debuted on the CBS radio network in 1935. The collection includes documentation related to their efforts to leverage new media like radio and television for their clients.

# Hagley Board Elects New Trustee

"We are proud of our 220-year history with DuPont and welcome Dr. Dembek to guide us in sharing new and interesting stories of innovation." Also at the March meeting, duPont thanked Ms. Mati Bonetti de Buccini, who stepped down as a trustee after serving for six years.


# Airport Showcases Patent Models

**N**early sixty patent models from Hagley's collection are on display at Philadelphia International Airport through the end of 2022. They're part of the airport's Exhibitions Program—a nationally recognized, award-winning visual arts initiative. The program, established by the airport in 1998, is an "initiative to humanize the airport environment, provide visibility for Philadelphia's unique cultural life, and to enrich the experience of the traveling public." Hagley staff members are proud to add the history of invention and innovation to the many stories on display at Philadelphia International.

The patent models are displayed between Terminals C and D through the end of the year, which includes the busy summer and holiday travel seasons at the airport. It also coincides with the projected late-summer opening of *Nation of Inventors* at Hagley.

Plus, *Patent Models: A Celebration of American Innovation*, at the Design and Innovation Building at University of California San Diego, has been extended through early November.

So, Hagley's patent models will be on view in temporary installations on both coasts when the new, permanent exhibition opens on the banks of the Brandywine.

**E**ACH SPRING WHEN I AM ASKED TO CONTRIBUTE THIS LETTER for Hagley's annual report, I enjoy recounting the successes of the past year at this truly outstanding institution. The museum and library teams did a tremendous job in 2021 navigating COVID restrictions put in place by the state and at the same time welcoming visitors and researchers to Hagley. Our special events felt more than special after a year's hiatus. Fireworks at Hagley made their triumphant return, as did the Hagley Car Show and Craft Fair, all with record attendance! Visitors from throughout the region continue to attend our popular Bike and Hike evenings as well as Halloween and Christmas festivities.

Hagley's gardens play an important role in our interpretive story. Following the restoration of the E. I. du Pont Garden a few years ago, we are now putting the finishing touches on the restored Rose Garden, which dates to the Victorian era, when Boss Henry du Pont was living at Eleutherian Mills. This renovation is an essential component to tell the complete story of the du Ponts' botanical past and their love of ornamental horticulture. The garden will include borders and accent plantings as it did over a century ago. Brick edging with a troweled mortar edge has already been installed to line the paths and to match the potager garden edging. A much-needed stormwater drainage system was installed in 2021 to channel water away from the garden and to keep the gravel paths from eroding.

In addition to the Rose Garden, a pollinator garden was planted in 2021 near the greenhouse to aid in the health of not only our gardens, but the local ecosystem. We also launched a one-of-a-kind partnership with Wilmington Brew Works. The staff from the brewery and Hagley picked fruit from the E. I. du Pont Orchard and developed three ciders using what came from our fruit trees. This partnership was featured on Philadelphia's WPVI-TV and other local media outlets. We are grateful to our corporate partners and other donors for supporting our horticultural endeavors.

In the library, our commitment to documenting the history and story of African American pioneers in STEM continued with the creation of a documentary on Dr. Wesley Memeger, Jr., which was produced in 2021 for Black History Month. If you'd like to see this documentary, please visit [hagley.org/memeger](http://hagley.org/memeger). Additional resources are being developed for expanding this important oral history project in 2022. Library collections continue to be a source of pride for Hagley, with notable additions to the collection, such as the records of the American Artists Group, a greeting card firm pioneering the use of original artwork by noteworthy American artists, as well as a significant addition to the records of Homsey Architects. In 2021, the library staff completed processing the records of the National Association of Manufacturers, an important business history resource for scholars. Currently, the collection includes more than 2,000 digitized images available



in the Hagley Digital Archives and nearly 1,100 boxes of manuscripts.

Hagley staff in all divisions developed a strategic plan for the institution that will guide Hagley through 2026 with a renewed focus on Relevance, Stewardship, and Sustainability. Our revised mission continues to emphasize our important historic site and the internationally recognized business history library: “Hagley Museum and Library seeks to inspire all people to be innovative in their own lives through investigation and exploration of our historical collections, original DuPont powder yards, and online resources.” The new strategic plan for 2026 is already beginning to guide our focus, and I am happy to report that goals are already being met, just one year into the plan! For example, website traffic increased to almost 502,000 users in 2021, an increase of 47% from 2020, thereby helping to meet our five-year goal. We’ll continue to add interesting content to our website each year to bring in additional visitors.

You may recall that last September, Hagley and the entire Brandywine Valley experienced devastating flooding. The Visitor Center, Breck’s Mill, and the powder yards took the brunt of the impact from the record floodwaters of more than 23 feet, closing the museum. This is not the first time that Hagley’s property has faced extreme challenges. During the years that black powder was produced on the site, beginning in 1802, not only did natural disasters such as floods occur, but occasional explosions also caused severe damage to what we now know as the most beautiful mile on the Brandywine. Throughout all of our history, we have continued to exemplify our core value of “safety first,” as all people and collections stayed safe during the flood. In the week after the floodwaters receded, Hagley’s staff went to work not only to clear the property and make it safe once

more, but also to determine how best to reopen, and when to do so. I could not be prouder of the staff for their recovery work, and also for their dedication to reopening the museum’s historic home and garden to the public in less than one week!

While the upper property became the center of operations for the museum, work continues on Hagley’s Visitor Center. Through the foresight and planning of our staff and contractors, in a move to prevent such damage in the future, we are moving most systems from the basement to other areas of the building, situating them above the high-water mark from last September. As you know, at the time of the flood we were eagerly awaiting the opening of the *Nation of Inventors* exhibition. Please check the Hagley website over the next several months for updates on this exciting new component to Hagley’s vast offerings.

I again would like to express my sincere gratitude to all of you who continue to contribute to Hagley in various ways throughout the year. Our donors, members, and Corporate Partners allow Hagley to continue to offer our very popular STEM educational programs and preserve and protect our property for many years to come. As I mentioned above, our staff and their resiliency during the past year have helped to make Hagley the strong institution that it is today. I wish all of you the very best and look forward to seeing you this year.


